Lesson 9: [“The Bible Should Be Studied Carefully”](#) (click to watch)

Main Idea: Careful study allows us to understand the Bible. We learn that the Bible is true when we read it, study it, and change our lives to match what it says.

Key Verse: “Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the Word of truth.”
2 Timothy 2:15

Ask These Questions:

1. **Is it possible to understand everything in the Bible?** (Yes! If we study the Bible, God helps us understand it. He also helps us change our lives to match what it says. He even helps us explain it to others!)
2. **What’s the first step to understanding the Bible?** (The first step is to *read it!* You learn music if you listen to it over and over. You memorize quotes from movies you watch over and over. When we study the Bible over and over, we will remember it the same way. It happens naturally!)
3. **Why would someone want to study the Bible carefully?** (People who don’t know the Bible have to figure out life on their own, which is impossible. But the Bible gives us clear instructions for how to handle even the hardest choices in life. When we know the Bible, we can live in a way that pleases God and protects us from painful mistakes that other people make. It shows us what God wants and how to choose it.)
4. **What should you do when you hear someone teaching about God or the Bible?** (You should check on your own to see if what they say matches what the Bible says. Some people ignore or change what the Bible says, causing confusion and mistakes. God wants us to teach His Word *exactly how it’s written.*)

Try This Activity:

You will need **3-5 pictures** for this activity. They can be physical pictures from around the house, or pictures you have in your phone (it **doesn’t matter what** they are of!). **With each picture**, go through the following “**view-and-quiz**” process: Allow your clubber(s) to **view the picture for 10 seconds**. Then, with only yourself looking at the picture, ask them **any 2 questions about the picture** (colors, numbers, position, etc.). See how many details they can remember correctly!

Explain that the more carefully we study God’s Word—the history, characters, details, and lessons about what God does, what people do and how God responds—the better we’ll remember and understand it.
