Lesson 10: [“Angelique from Rwanda”](#) (click to watch)

Main Idea: God loves all people all around the world. All people who have trusted in Jesus as Savior should let their lights shine before others so that they’ll see our good works and glorify God.

Key Verse: “In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.”
Matthew 5:14-16

Ask These Questions:

1. **Can people in other countries learn about Jesus?** (Yes! Angelique lives in Rwanda, a country in Africa, and she learned about Jesus by attending AWANA there. God loves all people in any country!)
2. **What happened to Angelique when she went to AWANA?** (She learned about Jesus, believed in Him, heard about how she could be forgiven and have a friendship with Jesus, and became a Christian.)
3. **What happened in her family?** (When Angelique became a Christian, it changed how she lived. Her family saw the change and they were happy about it. They became Christians so they could change, too.)
4. **What kinds of changes do you think they saw in Angelique?** (Let your clubber answer! Maybe the way she spoke, the way she treated her family and friends, the way she responded to problems, or the way she spent her time.)
5. **How should Jesus change the way you live? Are you a light?** (When we live the way Jesus wants us to live, others can see how much we love Him. They will see His light in us and want to follow Him, too.)

Try This Activity:

Have your Spark(s) **try a task in the dark** (matching socks, getting dressed, drawing a picture, sorting legos/crayons by color, walking through a homemade obstacle course, etc.). Then, turn the light on and see if they can do it better.

Explain that when Jesus is in our lives, the light of His love and truth shines from us. People who don’t know Jesus are lost, and they have to go through life in the dark. It is hard and confusing to live without Jesus, just like playing in the dark! But if we shine His light to others, it will help them see and come to Jesus.
